What you should know:

Why are they scary ???

Reactions may vary between some extra panting or pacing, wanting to hide, or wanting to be right next to you. You

Some suggestions

If your dog has a "safe spot" such as a crate that they stay in at night it may help to comfort them. You can also try our Adaptil products that have dog appeasing pheromones that mimic the pheromones that a mother dog emits to her puppies. We also can order some oral products like Clomicalm or Composure (Composure is for both dogs and cats).

Kitties that are scared often like to find a quiet dark place to hide. This might be a closet or a room with darkened windows. You could also try our Feliway product, it's a pheromone that helps a cat keep calm.
